Calling all Vendors – We quilters are loaded and ready to shop!

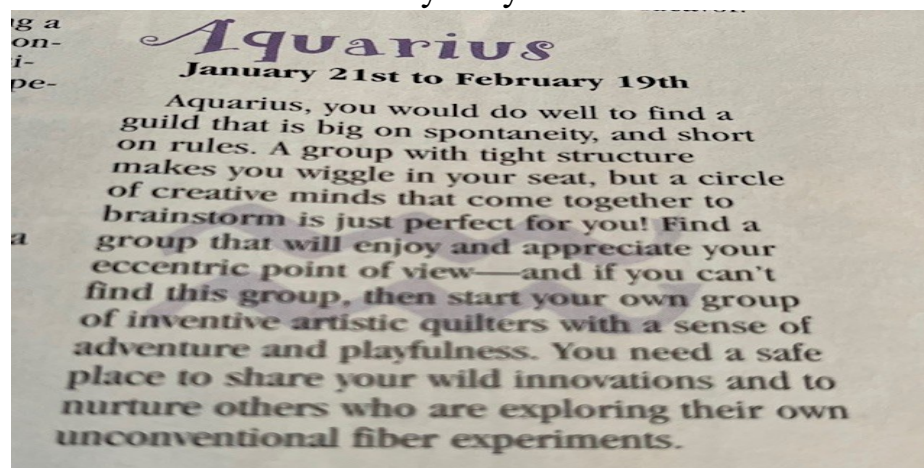
