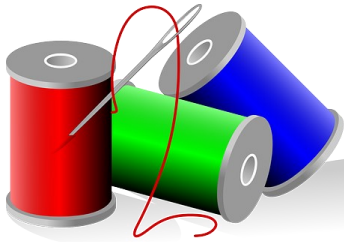

Check out the free app called Needle Travel! It's never been easier for Needle artists to find and visit their favorite shops: quilt, yarn, needlepoint, weaving, spinning, cross-stitch and/or embroidery. Just click on a shop near you and get driving directions. Or change the settings to limit the search (e.g., quilt only, or yarn and needlepoint only). You can even change the search area to see shops not just near you now, but shops near places where you intend to travel. It is "the most complete listing of fiber, fabric shops & guilds in the U.S." Use it on your next outing to find shops on your route.

runneth over.

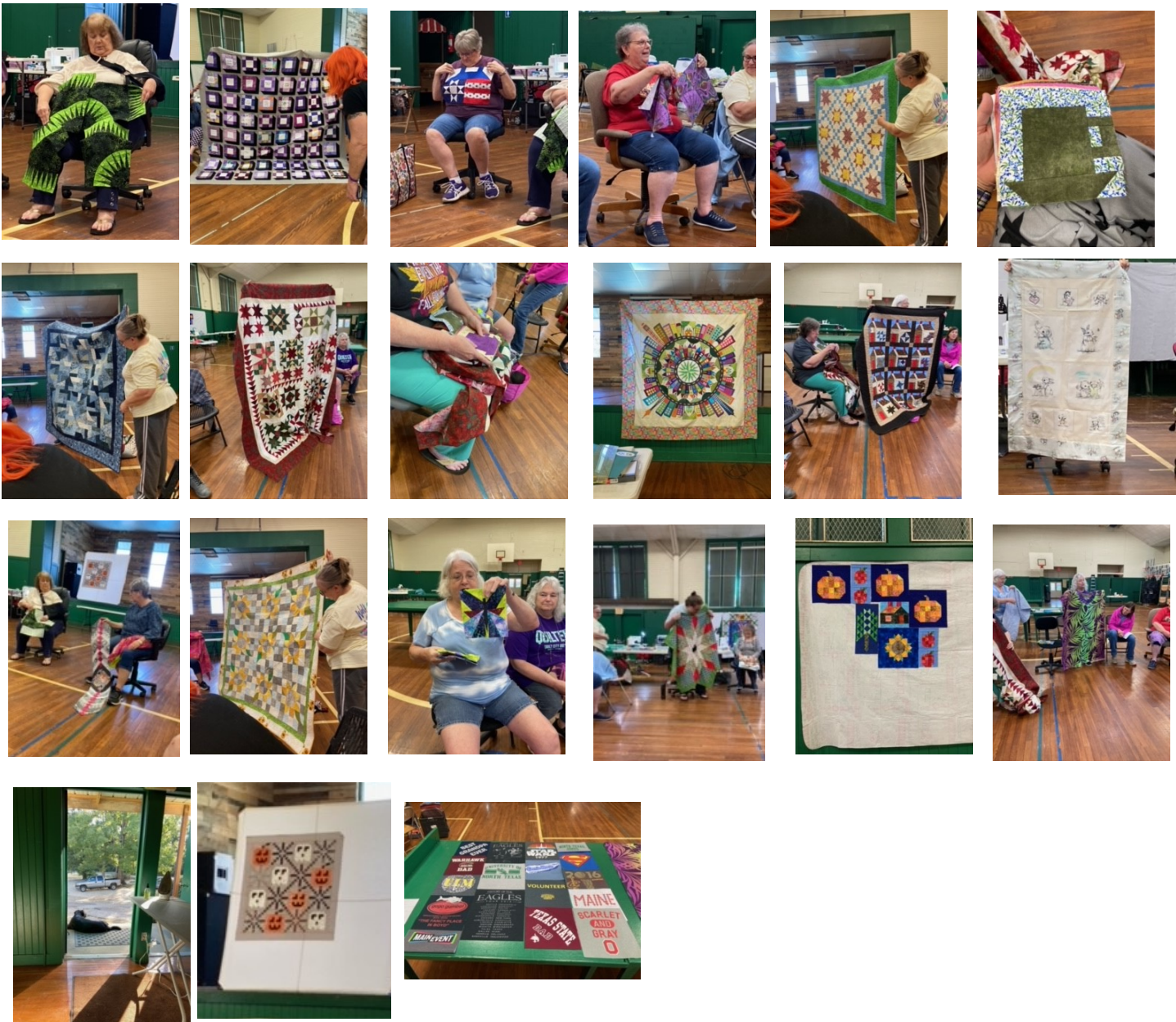
Surely quiltmaking shall fill my days as
